November 5, 2018

A regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was held in the Town Hall boardroom in Rico, Colorado during the morning on November 5, 2018, with the afternoon session held in the BOCC meeting room, Dove Creek, Colorado. Present for the meeting were Chairperson Steve Garchar, Commissioner Floyd Cook and Commissioner Julie Kibel. Agenda, Payroll and Expenditures

Commissioner Kibel made a motion to accept the agenda inclusive of additions and deletions, payroll and expenditures.

Southwest Water Conservation District and Colorado River District Presentation

Southwestern Water Conservation District Board Representative Bruce Whitehead gave an informative power point presentation and handout of the State of Colorado's Participation in Upper Division States' Demand Management Program and Storage Account in Lake Powell or other initial units of the Colorado River Storage Project Act. The presentation was given on behalf of the Colorado River Water Conservation District and the Southwestern Water Conservation District, which collectively represent Colorado's entire West Slope.

Law Enforcement Increased Town of Rico Presence Discussion

Town Manager Kari Distefano had questions regarding the County's working relationship with the Town of Dove Creek in regards to law enforcement presence and funding procedures. The County has a contract to provide certain services to the Town of Dove Creek. The Town pays for one full time employee's wages, benefits, a vehicle and equipment. The current contract will be sent to Ms. Distefano for review and possible consideration of something similar for the Town of Rico. Sheriff's Deputy Don Wilson was present to share details of the serviced provided through a previous position held by a prior resident and San Miguel County deputy employee. Rico Town Marshall Tom Halper requested a new radio and patrol vehicle. County inventory will be reviewed in an attempt to assist with the request.

Road and Bridge Equipment Purchases Discussion

Road and Bridge Supervisor Steve Davis, Road and Bridge Truck Foreman Lonnie Pribble and Road and Bridge Road Foreman John Nielson presented their top two purchase choices of low boy trailers for equipment hauling. After discussion the BOCC approved funding for the top choice to be purchased. Also discussed was the need for a rock stacker, a water truck and a roller packer. A rock stacker is not immediately necessary and will be discussed at a later date. The need for a water truck and a roller packer are both immediately necessary and both items for purchase will be sought.

Road and Bridge New Hire Discussion

Road and Bridge Supervisor Steve Davis, Road and Bridge Truck Foreman Lonnie Pribble and Road and Bridge Road Foreman John Nielson presented their top three choices of previously interviewed applicants with the Road and Bridge Department. Supervisor Davis would like to hire two employees.. After review and discussion, Commissioner Kibel stated she believes Supervisor Davis is familiar with the needs of his department and the departments workload and if he needs two employees then she supports that decision. Commissioner Cook gave his consent for the hire of two employees. Commissioner Garchar did not support the request for the hiring of two employees as he'd like to see one employee hired at this time.

New Business

Ormiston Fund Request Resolution #11-18-01: The Board of County Commissioners received a request for the distribution of funds from the Clara Ormiston Trust Fund. It was found that the applicant qualified as determined by the conditions of the Ormiston Trust Fund and was eligible to receive \$1000.00 for cancer treatments.

Commissioner Kibel made a motion to sign Resolution #11-18-01.

Commissioner Cook seconded the motion.

All three Commissioners voted in favor of the motion.

CDOT 53-11 Administration and Operation Contract: Senior Services Director Nita Purkat sent a previously reviewed Administration and Operation Contract. Attorney Golbricht reviewed the noted changes by Director Purkat and recommended signing.

Commissioner Kibel made a motion to sign the CDOT 53-11 Administration and Operation Contract for the Pioneer Center Senior Services.

Commissioner Cook seconded the motion.

All three Commissioners voted in favor of the motion.
